Patrick Yancey Exodus 24:12-18 2 Peter 1:16-21 "Eyewitness faith" 2/23/2020

## **Opening**

- What do you remember about your baptism?
  - I suppose how you answer that depends on how old you were when you were baptized.
  - If you were an infant, you might only recall what you've been told about it.
  - For me, I was baptized at about the age of the young people we will baptize and confirm this morning, during worship, so I remember it pretty well.
  - I remember thinking it wasn't that big of a deal- just going get a little wet and become a member of the church.
  - But then looking out at my family in the pews- and they were there in full forceall my grandparents, cousins, aunts and uncles.
    - And I saw my grandfather Winston- a deeply religious man, with tears flowing down his cheeks and I realized that this day was not just about me.
      - And this was a HUGE deal.
    - For some of those people, this event marked a milestone- and it was the answer to a LOT of prayer and they spoke about that day for many years after.
  - I remember that day so well, because I lived it first-hand.
- Do you remember where you were or what you were doing when you heard about the Space Shuttle Columbia disaster?
  - I also remember that day well.
    - I remember being at work, when the news interjected shock and fear into what would have otherwise been an ordinary work day.
    - I remember, because I saw it first-hand.
- How about the assassination of President John F. Kennedy- do you remember where you were or what you were doing on that day?
  - o I wasn't old enough to remember the details of that event.

- Yet in some ways, I feel like I was there, because of what my parents told me about it.
  - They told me of the bravery of his wife Jacqueline.
    - About the long funeral procession.
    - And little John saluting his father's casket as it passed by.
  - And those stories form indelible images in my mind.
- o Do you remember 9-1-1?
- Where were you and what were you doing when the Chiefs won the Superbowl?
- In our lives, there are moments in time which touch us and they become anchored in our memories.
  - And because we were there and we saw, we remember them with vivid detail.
  - That's what today's baptisms and confirmations will be like for the young people we will baptize today.
- And there are also those occurrences in the lives of people we know and we can recall those in detail, because someone told us about them.
  - I didn't live during the great depression, but I have an idea what it was like, because my parents lived through it and they told me about it.

## First-hand witnesses

- That is what is happening in today's scripture reading from 2 Peter.
  - Today is Transfiguration Sunday, a day recalling when Jesus takes Peter, James and John with him to the top of a high mountain and he shows them the radiance of God.
    - His face shines like the sun, and his clothes become as white as light.
    - And Moses and Elijah appear and talk with Jesus.
  - It must have been amazing for the three Disciples to be there and see this firsthand.
    - And one can be sure that they remembered that day for the rest of their lives.
    - They could never forget something so remarkable.
- And the author of 2 Peter is calling on the reader to remember what they have been told about this by people who were there.

- You see, the church had been around long enough that there were people who began to misrepresent the truth of the gospel.
- o They were questioning whether Jesus was truly coming back.
- o In John 14:3, Jesus said "When I go to prepare a place for you, I will return and take you to be with me..."
  - And people had expected that to be sooner, rather than later, but it had not happened.
  - And people were beginning to give up on that idea.
  - Many of the first disciples- who had proclaimed the return of Christ- had died and still Jesus had not returned.
- And the author is writing, to remind them that what they have been taught is the truth.
- I imagine most of us can relate to that, right?
  - I mean who here hasn't thought to themselves at least once "If I could just see
    Jesus and hear him preach and to watch him heal people."
    - "Gosh, if that could happen, faith would be easy."
    - And who hasn't wondered to themselves "Is Jesus EVER coming back and WHEN?"
  - O But as it is, we wait, just as they waited and there are times when doubts may begin to sneak in.
- But in the face of those doubts, we rediscover faith, by remembering what Jesus said.
  - o Because we have a written account to look to- written by people who were there and saw.
    - We have the benefit of history written down to help us understand the meaning of Jesus' life, death and resurrection.
    - And our minds can feed off of the thoughts of the greatest theologians who have shared their understanding of what it all means.
  - It was Jesus who said "Nobody knows when that day or hour will come, not the heavenly angels and not the Son. Only the Father knows. Therefore, stay alert!" (Matthew 24:36 & 42)
  - And it was Jesus who also said "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe." (John 20:29)

- In this letter, the author reminds the reader and reminds us- to keep the faith.
  - O He reminds us THAT PETER WAS THERE AT THE TRANSFIGURATION!
  - These are not man-made stories, they are eye-witness accounts.
  - The author urges the reader to remember what they already know, saying "We have a most reliable foretelling of what is to come, and you would do well to pay attention to it, just as you would to a lamp shining in the darkness."

## Attested to by scripture

- The author is saying "Pay attention! Have you forgotten that you have this written word? It's called the Gospel and it's written by people who were there."
  - "And this written word, proves the truth in what the prophets spoke long, long ago.
  - What they said about the Messiah has come true- it was proven true by Jesus' coming, as attested to by people who were there and saw.
  - o And these are not just words of people, but they are the Word of God.
  - o And just as the Messiah came before, he will come again.
- The purpose of this letter was to build for the reader, a foundation for the Gospel.
  - o A foundation which, long after Peter was gone, would fortify the reader.
  - Peter knew his time was short, and his concern was that after he was gone, people remain firm in their faith, because they know the truth of the Scriptures.
    - And he knew that if believers were grounded in this truth, they would not fail.
      - Because they would remember.

## Wrap it up

- Do you remember when you were a kid, how your parents always reminded you of stuff, you already knew?
  - Man, I was always annoyed by that.
  - Every day before I left for school, my dad would give me a list of reminders.
    - Remember to wear your coat.
    - Do you have your house key with you?
    - Did you remember to get lunch money?
    - Etc. Etc.

- o That list of reminders didn't change for 12 years and I knew it by heart.
  - And yet, my dad went over that list again and again- every day- so that I would remember.
  - I still remember it to this day.
- That's what it's like with today's scripture.
  - Peter knows that they know the truth in the scriptures.
  - He just wants to remind them- again- so that they don't get lost.
- Peter reminds us in the same way today.
  - He gives us our daily list, even though we already know it.
    - Did you remember that Peter, James and John, were there when Jesus showed the Glory of God?
    - Did you remember that the Gospels are not just myth or legend, but they are written by people who were present with Jesus when these things happened?
    - Did you remember to wear God's spirit in your heart today?
  - Like a father who fusses over his kids, this scripture reminds us of what we already know.
    - But we are reminded none-the-less, so that we always remember.
  - For each of us the challenge is to remember again, and to remind ourselves continually, that the Gospel is the truth of God.
- As we baptize and confirm our young disciples this morning, they will have an experience to remember all they days of their journey.
  - May we also be reminded of our own Baptism.
  - May we be reminded of the truth, grounded in God's word.
  - o And may we rely on that truth, live into it and let it transform us.
